## PRESENTATION

[Elise Dermineur Reuterswärd](#) is Associate Professor at [Stockholm University](#) and at [Umeå University](#). Moreover, she was until 2022 a Pro Futura Scientia fellow at the [Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study](#) in Uppsala. She graduated 2011 with a PhD degree in History at [Purdue University](#) with a thesis entitled “Women in Rural Society: Peasants, Patriarchy and the Local Economy in Northeast France, 1650–1789”. Her research interests range from the history of justice and economics to gender and women’s history. She is currently completing a monograph on banking before banks, examining closely financial markets and its actors.

## ACTIVITIES IN FRANCE

Elise Dermineur Reuterswärd met with different researchers, including [Laurence Fontaine](#) from the [CNRS](#) and [EHESS](#), [Matteo Pompermaier](#) from the [University of Rouen](#) and [Yane Svetiev](#), from [Bocconi University](#) and [Sydney School of Law](#). Elise Dermineur Reuterswärd exchanged for instance ideas with Laurence Fontaine whose works and books such as “L’économie morale et Le Marché” inspired her.

During her stay, she visited the [BNF](#) (National Library of France) where she had the opportunity to get access to relevant literature for her above-mentioned manuscript and the visit at the “[Cité de l’économie et de la monnaie](#)” allowed her also to collect some interesting information for her ongoing work.

Finally, potential collaborations have been initiated, in particular with Matteo Pompermaier on a project entitled “Women and Credit Networks”. Moreover, the participation of Laurence Fontaine in a conference in Umeå 2020 and a research visit at the University have been discussed.
