She has worked internationally in a wide range of research and industrial facilities on projects aimed at addressing challenges in aquaculture production, specifically raising, harvesting, and handling seafood safely and profitably. She graduated 2009 with a PhD degree in Resource Management from the [University of British Columbia](#).

ACTIVITIES IN FRANCE

Alyssa Joyce visited the [University of Brest](#) and met Luc Chaucher working on bioreactors for algal production. She also met [Grégory Charrier](#), a genetics expert working with fisheries of Coquilles Saint-Jacques and [Elodie Fleury](#), expert in shellfish production.

Alyssa Joyce had the opportunity to visit a hatchery with [Pierre Boudry](#) from [IFREMER](#), the National Institute for Ocean Sciences and to get a tour of the facilities. She discovered also the [marine biological station in Roscoff](#) to prepare future collaboration. Her PhD students expressed indeed interest in exchanges with Roscoff for algal related work.

The main goal of her visit was thus to develop her European network and exposure to French researchers to foster collaboration, for example with a common Horizon 2020 proposal with her French colleagues.
