## PRESENTATION

[Florian Stammler](#) has done research in many regions of the Russian North since the mid 1990s. The researcher's interest lie in the anthropology of nomadic societies, with a particular emphasis on animal husbandry in Arctic regions, including reindeer herding, horse herding, and cattle breeding. Since the anthropology team's big ORHELIA project, he has started working comparatively with people living in the Western European Arctic in Finland and Greenland, and led several research projects working with Western and Russian Arctic societies and cultures. He holds the anthropology professorship at the [Arctic Centre](#), [University of Lapland](#).

## ACTIVITIES IN FRANCE

During his visit at [Paris-Saclay University](#), Florian Stammler met with [Samuel Roturier](#) and [Simon Maraud](#). At [Agro Paris Tech](#), they discussed plans within Belmont Forum's BIODIVERSA FATE project. That project looked at consequences of Arctic climate change for reindeer herding societies. They planned the organization of a November 2022 workshop on co-production of knowledge with indigenous people in the Arctic, which in the end had to be cancelled for political reasons connected to the Russian War in Ukraine. They also discussed avenues to integrate different ways of knowing the Arctic environment, in relation to the existing literature, and at some point this will lead to joint scholarly publications. He also met with [Charles Stépanoff](#), [EHESS Paris](#), leading French anthropologist, and his past and current PhD students in order to discuss their research on human-animal relations.
