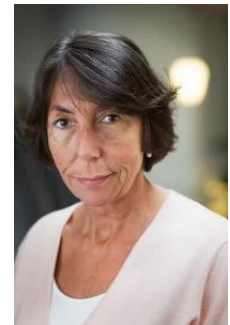

PRESENTATION

[Cécile Brokelind](#) is a Professor at the [Department of Business Law](#) at [Lund University](#). She is also Chairwoman of the European Association of Tax Law Professors ([EATLP](#)) and co-founded the Group for Research on European International Tax Law ([GREIT](#)) in Lund. She is interested in the development of the rule of law in the European Union (EU) and other international organizations in the field of direct taxation. Recent focus has been directed toward human rights and taxation, and individual taxation of cross-border pensions. She defended her PhD thesis at the [School of Economics and Management](#) at Lund University in 1990.

ACTIVITIES IN FRANCE

During her mobility to France, she met with [Prof. Thierry Lambert](#) from the Centre d'Etudes Fiscales et Financières [CEFF](#) at the [University Aix Marseille](#) and Editor of the [European and International Review of Fiscal Law](#). At CEFF, she also exchanged views with [Prof. Jean-Luc Albert](#).

Furthermore, she visited the Centre d'Etudes et de Recherches Internationales et Communautaires [CERIC](#), where she met with [Prof. Sandrine Maljean Dubois](#), [Prof. Estelle Brosset](#), [Prof. Marie Lamoureux](#), and [Prof. Nathalie Rubio](#), Director of CERIC.

They had the opportunity to discuss recent research activities in fiscality and EU law. Brokelind was also in Aix-en-Provence to access the library of law and consult exclusive literature.

Possible future invitations as Guest Professor were tabled; and several joint publications with Prof. Lambert on Scandinavian fiscality were envisaged. Dubois and Brosset were included in Brokelind's plans to organize an international conference on environment fiscality in 2018/2019, and their mutual interest in state aid was discussed.

She also held a conference on the state of ecotaxes in Sweden and wrote an article on the same subject.
