[Andreea Cosnita Langlais](#) is Associate Professor of Economics at [EconomiX](#) under the Institute of Humanities and Social Sciences ([INSHS](#)) of the French National Centre for Scientific Research ([CNRS](#)) at the [University Paris-Nanterre](#). She is interested in industrial economy and competition policy, economic law and spatial competition. She obtained her PhD in Economics from [University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne](#) in 2006 and was habilitated (HDR) in 2015 at the [University of Montpellier](#).

## ACTIVITIES IN SWEDEN

Andreea Cosnita Langlais visited the Research Institute for Industrial Economics ([IFN](#)) and the [Department of Economics](#) of the Stockholm School of Economics ([SSE](#)), where research related to her own work on the enforcement and design of competition policy is conducted. She had the opportunity to discuss merger control with [Richard Friberg](#), Professor of Economics and Head of the Economics Department at SSE. Friberg's work is empirical whereas Cosnita Langlais conducts theoretical research, which gave them both the opportunity to test their research against each other's methods.

She was also invited to hold a seminar talk on the trade-off between public and private enforcement of antitrust in Europe. Discussions with [Chloé Le Coq](#) ([Stockholm Institute of Transition Economics](#), SSE) and [Mark Bernard](#) (Senior Analyst at the Swedish Post and Telecom Authority [PTS](#)) on cartel or merger trade-offs and the European Commission's antitrust case evaluations involving telecom operators ensued.

She also held a seminar talk at the IFN, where she met with [Martin Olsson](#), [Thomas Tangerås](#) and [Joacim Tåg](#), with whom she deliberated on telecom regulation, political economy and industrial organization.
