PRESENTATION

[Jérôme Dinet](#) is a Professor and Director of the Psychology and Neuroscience Lab ([2LPN](#)) under the [Department of Psychology](#) at the [University of Lorraine](#). He is interested in learning processes, emotion interaction, life-span psychology, human-machine interaction, perception of risks and epistemology in psychology. He obtained his PhD in 2002 from the [University of Poitiers](#) and was habilitated in 2012 at the University of Lorraine.

ACTIVITIES IN SWEDEN

Jérôme Dinet visited [Uppsala University](#) and the Departments of [Education](#) and [Psychology](#). He met with a number of colleagues in developmental psychology and education. For instance, he exchanged views extensively with [Gustaf Gredebäck](#), Director of the “[Child & Baby Lab](#)” at the Department of Psychology. Comparing and coordinating their data, they saw great resemblances confirming their mutual conclusions. At the Department of Education, he had the opportunity to discuss among others urban vulnerabilities of juvenile pedestrians with [Tanja Joelsson](#) (now at [Stockholm University](#)), [Katarina Gustafson](#), [Danielle van der Burgt](#), [Martin Karlberg](#) and the Director of the Department, [Henrik Edgren](#).

Several collaborations were born. For instance, a scientific network around “Mobility & Security” in the framework of H2020 was envisaged, an guest professorship invitation of the Swedish colleagues to his (at the time) [laboratory InterPsy](#) was extended, a joint experimental study on child pedestrians in urban environments with surrounding vehicles was planned, and a co-tutored PhD program was tabled.

An ERASMUS+ agreement was signed between the two institutions and several student mobilities were already announced.
